2006 Lilac Festival

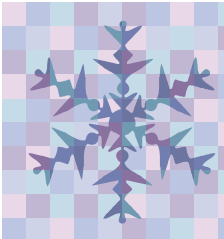

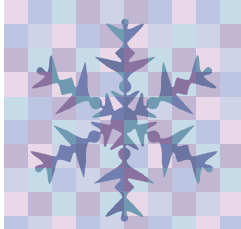

How Will Your Ideas Be Used ?

Ideas will be shared with the Centre City Team, who will take them into consideration when developing the draft plan. This plan will then be shared with stakeholders for comment. The final plan will be taken forward to City Council for approval (early 2006). Once approved, recommended short and long-term action plans can be implemented.

Where Is Centre City ?

Centre City is defined as Calgary's downtown, from the Elbow River to 14 St. S.W. and 17 Ave. S. to the Bow River and includes the Stampede grounds and the Beltline.

What Will The Centre City Plan Do ?

The Centre City Plan (CCP), when complete, is meant to be a plan of vision and ideas from a wide cross-section of stakeholders. The CCP will be a strategy that will guide the interrelated plans and policies for the downtown and the Beltline (referred to as the "family of plans"). It will include strategies and actions for a broad range of dimensions and areas within Centre City.
